Lions Eye Institute

The Lions Eye Institute (LEI) has spent \$37,764 since July 2011 to pay for care for patients without insurance or the means to cover their medical expenses. This money helped 15 patients. Of the 15, five were treated for cornea issues, four for glaucoma, two for cataracts, one for retina issues, one for low vision, and two for miscellaneous problems. With other expenses such as support for research and education programs, total expenses during that time were \$43,000.

Costs continue to rise as more and more people need help in the current economy, said Lion John McDonald, LEI president. Since 2004, the LEI has helped 44 patients as a cost of \$117,791. A total of \$87,000 has been spent in the last year and a half, counting patient care and other expenses. At the current rate, the LEI will be broke in two years, Lion John said.

At the February board meeting, the LEI discussed such strategies as putting a cap on the amount that can be spent on one patient.

Efforts to increase funding also continue. The Lion's Foundation at Albany, Inc., chaired by PDG Dick Nason, is responsible for funding the LEI.

The sale of chocolate Easter bunnies is under way, but Lion Mary Fleming, chairman of the bunny committee, said orders are down by 866 bunnies from last year, possibly because dark chocolate bunnies are not available this year.

The second major source of funding for the Foundation is the Knights of the Blind program. Members of the Foundation and LEI boards are visiting clubs throughout Districts 20-O, 20-Y2, and 20-W, which jointly sponsor the LEI, to explain the work done at the Eye Institute and to urge more Lions to become Knights of the Blind. At its last cabinet meeting, District 20-Y2 voted to donate \$1,000 to the foundation for two Knights of the Blind who will be named later.

Four new Knight of the Blind (KOB) awards have been announced in 2012. The newest to be honored are Lion Bernard Wood of the Schuylerville Lions and Lions Scott and Karen Rager of the Glens Falls Lions. In addition, the MD20 NY and Bermuda Foundation presented a KOB award in memory of Brian Smith, the son of PDG Milledge (Smitty) R. Smith of the South Jefferson Lions Club.

In 2011, KOB Awards went to Lion L. Clifford Van Wagner, Saratoga Springs Lions; Lions Stuart S. and Ilene J. Wizwer, Town of Fallsburg Lions; Lions John N. Imperato and David E. Maier, Rhinebeck Lions; Lion Charles Leoni, Duane Lions; Lions Marianne and Stephen Lynch, Granville Lions; Lion David Hodgkins, Guilderland Lions; Lion Frances V. Mezza, Gloversville Lions; Lion Anita LeBelle; and Lion Joseph Grono, Town of Greenfield Lions.
