Lions Eye Institute/Lions Foundation

The Lions Eye Institute and the Lions Foundation at Albany are looking for new board members from Districts O, Y2, and W.

The Lions Foundation raises funds for the Lions Eye Institute, which is a joint project of the three Lions Districts. Most of the money raised goes to care for patients who do not have insurance, do not qualify for Medicaid, and cannot pay for their own treatments.

The Foundation also supports research and graduate education at the Eye Institute. Each year, four medical school graduates serve in a residency program at the Institute in conjunction with Albany Medical College. The prestige of the Eye Institute is so high that large numbers of potential residents apply for the four positions and the doctors are able to pick the “cream of the crop.”

Letters have gone out to club presidents in all three districts seeking increased support in recognition of the growing demand for services. Members of both boards have also been visiting clubs in the three districts to describe the Lions Eye Institute program and to answer questions.

The Foundation raises money through two programs – the sale of chocolate Easter bunnies and gifts made to honor people as Knights of the Blind (KOBs).

The latest donations for KOBs include \$1,000 from the Granville Lions Club for two future awards, \$500 from the Middletown Lions Club to honor Lion “Rollin Lybolt,” \$500 from the Hurley Lions Club to honor Joseph H. Decker Sr., \$500 from Prism Associates to honor Lion Bridget B. Pierce (a member of the Town of Hoosick Lions), and \$500 from Ismal Colon in honor of Dorothy M. Todd.

Donations toward future Knight of the Blind awards came from Dick Cipperly, Robert Eaton (in memory of Rosalie B. Eaton), the Cambridge Lions Club, and the Fort Edward Lions Club.

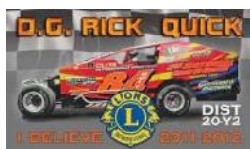
